From the Pastor's Desk

Dear beloved church,

Grace and peace to you,

I believe you are tired of the lockdown and social distancing. You may be anxious about your health and future. You see the sunshine, and you are hesitant to go out to enjoy it. You might question your faith and wonder where God is in your struggle. You hear about people dying from COVID-19, and that 1.1 million people are infected by it in the United States. As of now, we have no vaccine. This is alarming news. The mystery of suffering is unanswerable. So, what shall we do in this challenging time? Where to go to gain strength? I expect that many of you would answer, go to Jesus Christ. Yes, this is very true. Our Lord Jesus Christ gives us strength and wisdom to manage our life in this disturbing time.

I would like to talk to you about spiritual perseverance. All of us need to persevere while we are walking through the valley of the shadow of death (Psalm 23:4). What does perseverance mean? Perseverance means “persisting in, or remaining constant to a purpose, task or belief in spite of obstacles and opposition. It is the ability to endure pain, disappointment, and discomfort without quitting or letting down.”¹ The New Testament Greek word for perseverance, *Hupomone*, suggests “energetic resistance, steadfastness under pressure, and endurance in the face of trials.”² Perseverance is like a person who keeps on walking despite bearing a heavy load on his/her shoulders. Sometimes, the Bible translates perseverance as endurance and steadfastness.

Suffering and trials are around us from the moment we are born. No one is immune to hardship and turbulence. Experiencing trials and hardship does not make you any less of a Christian. Most sincere and faithful Christians have endured trials in their lives. The best example is the apostle Paul, who endured hardship for the sake of the gospel.

But as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities,⁵ beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger;⁶ by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love,⁷ truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left;⁸ in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true;⁹ as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see—we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed;¹⁰ as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything (2 Corinthians 6:4-10 NRSV).

The apostle Paul overcame all these trials and became victorious because he persevered. God does not enjoy seeing you suffer. God allows you to walk through the valley of the shadow of death, like COVID-19, to help you to grow in faith and to produce good character. God molds you to become a better Christian. God walks with you through the valley of the shadow of death. The apostle James teaches in James 1:2-4 NRSV

² My brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of any kind, consider it nothing but joy, ³ because you know that the testing of your faith produces endurance; ⁴ and let endurance have its full effect, so that you may be mature and complete, lacking in nothing.

How are you going to understand what faith and mercy are without facing suffering? Persevere in your faith during the COVID-19 trial and open your heart to welcome God to develop God's qualities in you. Hold on to your faith. Because without your faith, you will not pass this trial. God is testing your faith using COVID-19.

Be aware of the devil's lies. The devil whispers to your ears and tells you that you are neglected, God does not care about you and the world, you are doomed to destruction, or you will die without anyone beside you. The devil is eager to make you anxious and fearful. The only way to dismiss the devil's lies is to trust in God's promises through Jesus Christ. These promises are revealed in Scripture. So, draw near to God and God's word. Your faith gives you the power to persevere. The apostle Paul says, "So faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes through the word of Christ." (Romans 10:17 NRSV). You need your Bible. Use it, and do not leave it on the shelf.

Hold on to God's promises every time the devil whispers lies to your ears. As you need the word of God to remain steadfast in the COVID-19 trial, you need your church family to strengthen and encourage you. So, call one another to share your story of faith. Your story of faith can lift up the spirit of your anxious and suffering neighbor. We need each other to persevere in this difficult time.

Please, my friends, do not hesitate to talk to me if you need spiritual care. I will make myself available.







1. Devotions were led by Pastor Niveen at 6:19pm. Readings from Matthew chapter 6 and discussion on fasting for lent.
 2. The meeting was called to order by Bob Henning at 6:26pm.
 3. The CART team (Crisis Assessment Response Team) was asked to join the council meeting and have discussion so that we would be better prepared to deal with those having mental health issues, suicidal tendencies, drug and alcohol issues, and child behavioral issues.
 4. Pastor's report
 - a. Pastor Niveen had 3 services on Ash Wednesday - Primrose, here at ILC, and at Grace United Church of Christ.
 - b. Pastor Niveen attended a conference in San Diego that had 380 participants.
 - c. Pastor Niveen will be presenting the sermon and a bible study at St. Annes Catholic Church on Thursday April 2nd.
 - d. Our conference is collecting new nail clippers from March 1st through mid-May.
 - e. Pastor Niveen will be having bible study starting April 8th at 10:45 in the fellowship hall.
 - f. It was suggested that we consider having a pizza sale to raise money for confirmation camp scholarships.
 5. Church officer reports
 - a. Secretary report - The January Secretary Report was previously e-mailed to all council members. There is a correction regarding item 4.d. where it was noted that the remaining loan amount for 629 Hamilton was approximately \$12,000 where in fact it is over \$14,000. A motion was made by Jerry to accept the minutes as printed. A second was made by Patti. Motion passed.
 - b. Treasurer report - Matt submitted the January and YTD Profit & Loss Budget Performance Report. A motion was made by Patti to accept and hold the treasurer report for audit. A second was made by Janci. Motion passed.
 - c. Financial secretary report - Patti submitted the January Financial Secretary Reports. A motion was made by Judy K to accept and hold the financial secretary report for audit. A second was made by Jerry N. Motion passed.
 - d. Vice-President report - On Saturday May 16th we will have an antique sale here at ILC from 10am to 4pm with the funds being used for Crossways Scholarships. The nominating committee needs to know which positions will need to be filled. The next community dinner hosted by ILC will be on April 26th.
 - e. President report - The \$10,000 grant was received to be used to further our mission. A portion of that will be dispersed to LSS, Lobatla Parish, and to Christians for Middle East Peace.
 6. Committee reports
 - a. Education - Sunday School meets every other Sunday with normally 5-6 students.
- Considering bibles to be given to the 3rd grade students.
- b. Evangelism - no report.
 - c. Properties - Recent properties items completed; snow removal in parking lot, heating system pump repair, cleared snow and put heat tape on flat roofs, and air filters were purchased for air handlers. Special thanks to Dan and Holly Westaby and to Jorden and Justin Nickolai for helping with properties activities. Future items needing attention; walls and window in nursery, ceilings in the gathering space and the stairway to the choir loft, Jerry will be speaking with Art Dellenbach to have outlets put on the roof for heat strips, and Jerry will review wireless microphones for pastor and the assistant minister.
 - d. Social Concerns - no report.
 - e. Stewardship - no report.
 - f. Youth - Bob attended the sleepover at United Methodist Church
 - g. Worship - 22 people were in attendance at the afternoon Ash Wednesday service at ILC. Midweek Lenten services will be held at 1:00pm in the Sanctuary and at 6:00pm in the chapel. Maundy Thursday service will be at 7:00pm. Good Friday service will be at 1:00pm. Saturday service will be at 7:00pm. Easter Sunday service will be at 9:00am.
7. Unfinished Business
 - a. Audit committee -The Audit Committee report was received for 2018. A motion was made by Janci to accept the report. A second was made by Mike. Motion passed. We will try to recruit a third member to replace Jackie on the audit committee.
 - b. Policies are still needed for the following items: - same sex members or employees - same sex marriage requests
 - c. Regarding church owned or donated items - A preliminary draft was written for the procedure for selling church owned or donated items. We will ask Bob Reinertson for review.

 - b. The semi-annual congregation meeting will be on Sunday May 31st.
